How to use this Bulletin

To learn more about a project:

- Call the planner assigned to the project to make arrangements to review the project files.
- Visit City Hall Public Records between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Friday and review the project files.
- Click the name of the project to view digital plans.

To comment on a project:

- Send your comments in writing to the Development Services Department, and be sure to include your name and address.
- Comments will be accepted until the time a staff report is prepared for the decision or recommendation, with a minimum comment period of at least 14 days (30 days for shoreline projects).
- If you submit a written comment, we will send you a copy of the notice of decision or recommendation.

To appeal a permit decision:

- You must have filed a written comment expressing your concerns before the decision was made.
- Any appeal of a DSD decision to the Hearing Examiner must be received by the City Clerk's Office no later than 5 p.m. on the appeal deadline indicated on the notice. The appeal must include a written statement in the form described in LUC 20.35.250.A.2 together with an appeal notification form. Link to Form
- An appeal of a shoreline decision is made to the State Shoreline Hearing Board, must be in writing, and must be filed within 21 days of the date the DSD decision is received by the State Department of Ecology (DOE). The DSD decision will be sent to DOE by the close of business on the date of this notice. GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING USE OF OPTIONAL DNS PROCESS

When the **SEPA** field indicates a **Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS)** is expected, the optional DNS process is being used and a DNS is likely. This may be the only opportunity to comment on the environmental impacts of the proposal. The proposal may include mitigation measures under applicable codes, and the project review process may incorporate or require mitigation measures regardless of whether an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is prepared. The Threshold Determination will also be noticed in a subsequent issue of this Weekly Permit Bulletin. A copy of the subsequent Threshold Determination for the proposal may be obtained upon request.

Description: The **East Bellevue Community Council** (EBCC) will hold a final public hearing

during its Regular Meeting on Tuesday, October 3, 2017 at 6:30 p.m., in the Lake Hills Clubhouse, 15230 Lake Hills Boulevard, to consider and take final action on Land Use Code Amendment that was adopted by the City Council in Ordinance No. 6366. The action was originally scheduled for September 5, 2017, but was postponed due to time constraints. On August 7, 2017, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 6366 which implements the recommendations of the City's Eastgate / I-90 Land Use and Transportation Project Citizens' Advisory Committee Report. The project was intended to support the continued success of Eastgate as a major employment center, support adjacent neighborhoods with neighborhood serving businesses and establish a mixed use transit-oriented development center. Ordinance No. 6366 establishes three new districts and associated development standards for application in the Eastgate Corridor: the Eastgate Transit Oriented Development District, the Neighborhood Mixed Use District (NMU), and the Office Limited Business 2 (OLB 2) District. The NMU and OLB 2 Districts may be applied citywide. The EBCC will take final action on the application of the NMU District and OLB 2 District to areas within East Bellevue Community Council (EBCC) jurisdiction. If approved, the NMU and OLB 2 Districts could be applied to parcels within the EBCC jurisdiction with a Comprehensive Plan

Amendment and a rezone.

Description: The **East Bellevue Community Council** (EBCC) will hold a final public hearing

during its Regular Meeting on Tuesday,

October 3, 2017 at 6:30 p.m., in the Lake Hills Clubhouse, 15230 Lake Hills Boulevard, to consider and take final action on Ordinance No. 6369 imposing an Interim Official Control that amends the Land Use Code (LUC) to prohibit Community Health Engagement Locations (CHELs), safe injection sites, and other uses or activities designed to provide a location for individuals to consume illicit drugs. The Growth Management Act, RCW 36.70A.390, states that an Interim Official Control may be effective for six (6) months. At the same meeting, the EBCC will hold a Courtesy Hearing on whether the Interim Official Control should be made permanent. Permanent regulations will be prepared during the effective period of this Interim Official Control and may be adopted by the City Council as soon as October 2017.
