The project location is zoned R-4 and R-1.8 and is located within the jurisdictional area of the East Bellevue Community Council.

This is a Process III application. The site is located in the East Bellevue Community Council (EBCC) area. Under Process III, the Hearing Examiner makes a recommendation to the City Council, which is the decision-making body. Should Council approve the application, the matter will be heard by the EBCC.

Should Council deny the application, the decision is appealable to Superior Court.

The Hearing Examiner recommends Council approval of the amendment subject to conditions.)

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
